Mission Statement

The Doctor of Education in Educational Leadership degree program at Midwestern State University reflects National Educational Leadership Preparation (NELP) standards developed by a committee comprised of essential stakeholder communities from across the country.

Students will work in informal cohorts to apply educational leadership knowledge and skills to current school issues, often in actual school settings.

Students who complete the Ed.D. program are eligible to apply for Texas Superintendent Certification upon satisfactory completion of relevant coursework, practicum, and state examination.

The Ed.D. in Educational Leadership requires 54 semester hours (57 for the superintendent certificate). The curriculum focuses on knowledge and leadership skills for district leadership.

Program objectives include: a knowledge of educational theory and practice, the ability to accurately use research methodology and interpretation to impact practice, and skills in district leadership and management.
