IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Sharon Arnoult, Associate Professor of History, presented a paper, "Mother-patterns of Virtue: Gender ideology and rearing the young gentlewoman in early modern England," during the British Scholar Conference at The University of Texas at Austin.

Steve Hilton was invited to participate in an International Ceramics Symposium titled *Earth, Image, Science* in Camagüey, Cuba for the month of December 2010. During this symposia, the 15 invited international artist presented lectures on their work, made art for a forthcoming ceramics museum, had work in an exhibition at the Doña Iris Gallery, and built a ceramic mural for the Camagüey Civic Center. After the conference, Hilton spent a week in Habana and surrounding provinces looking for ceramic artist to bring to the United States for

an upcoming NCECA (National Council for the Education of Ceramic Arts) conference.

KyoungHwa Oh, the current ceramic resident artist, and **Steve Hilton** were both invited to exhibit their work in the juried exhibition, *Feats of Clay XXIV*, in Lincoln, CA, one of the most prestigious international ceramic exhibitions in the United States.
