1.) Payroll Deduction (Pre-Tax)

If you prefer to use payroll deduction, please click on the link below and complete the authorization form. Submit the completed form to the Payroll Office - Hardin Administration Building Room 209.

The payroll deduction option lowers the taxable gross on your W-2 and is non-reportable when filing taxes. Deduction amounts are \$50 for faculty/staff, \$150 for deans of colleges, and \$250 for the President/vice presidents.

To pay by cash or check, you will need to visit the MSU Police Department (located at the corner of Hampstead and Louis J. Rodriguez Drive) or the MSU Business Office (located in Hardin, Room 103).

Drs. Rebecca Dodge, Sheldon Wang, and Magaly Rincón-Zachary (team leader) attended a workshop called Institutionalizing Undergraduate Research for State Systems and Consortia, June 28-30. The workshop was organized by the Council on Undergraduate Research and COPLAC and funded by the National Science Foundation. Teams from 23 COPLAC institutions attended the workshop at the UNC-Ashville campus. Each team prepared an action plan to work toward institutionalizing undergraduate research at their respective campuses. The MSU team will announce the action plan soon.
