Procurement of Toner & Ink Cartridges

The Budget Oversight Committee has determined that toner cartridges are to be ordered through the purchasing department. The purchasing department has solicited bids from several companies, and have determined that two companies are to receive MSU business for toner and ink cartridges.

- Wilson Office Supply is to receive p-card orders for **Dell** printer cartridges only.
- Dream Ranch LLC will receive all other p-card orders for toner and ink cartridges.

When ordering through these two companies you will be ordering remanufactured cartridges. These cartridges

have the same warranty as new cartridges but at a significantly lower price, which is a 30-60% savings to MSU.

To order Dell printer cartridges only, contact Mr. Terry Baird of Wilson Office Supply at 723-4174 and pay with your procurement card.

To order all other brands of toner and ink cartridges, contact Ms. Sheri deWet at Dream Ranch via e-mail Sheri@dreamranchtx.com. She will correspond back to you advising how to order through her company. You will continue to use your p-card for payments. If you do not have a p-card, fill out a Banner requisition and forward to the purchasing department. If you have any questions, contact Lori Case in the purchasing department at ext. 4041.

In an effort to bring cost savings to the university, the Central Warehouse is now stocking 8-1/2" x 11" copy paper for the university to use in printers and copiers.
