## **IN THE SPOTLIGHT**

**Kevin Bazner**, Coordinator of Greek Life, facilitated Session 3 of the Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute May 21-25. During the five-day institute, he worked with undergraduate participants developing key leadership skills and awareness of critical issues facing fraternity/sorority communities, and aided students to apply their newly refined skills when they return to their campuses. He will also work with a cohort of 20 students from around the country during the upcoming year to further develop the skills learned in order to enhance the fraternal experience on the students' campuses. He was one of 160 fraternity/sorority professionals from across the country selected to facilitate one of the five-day sessions held on the campus of Indiana University in Bloomington.
