James R. Pace: *Persolitikal*

Join James Pace in a gallery discussion of his paintings currently on display 3 p.m., Wednesday, January 18, at the Museum of Art at Midwestern State University. Pace is a professor of visual art at the University of Texas-Tyler where he has taught since 1985. He holds a MFA from Arizona State University and a BFA from the University of Oklahoma. Pace has exhibited nationally and internationally since 1976 and has received numerous awards for his paintings, drawings, and prints. Pace was appointed to the Oge Professorship in Visual Art, to the White Fellowship for Excellence in Teaching, and received the Chancellor's Council Teaching Award. Pace trained in the Tamarind Summer Printmaking Program, and he was selected to participate in the International Artist Residency Program in Budapest, Hungary.

Artist-Lecture Series: Reed Timmer

Artist-Lecture Series presents Reed Timmer at 7 p.m. Tuesday, January 24, in Akin Auditorium. Timmer's first official storm chase was at the age of 13 when he intercepted a severe storm in his front yard and was pelted by golf-ball sized hail that destroyed his family's video camera. Since that day, he's been obsessed with extreme weather and storm chasing. Timmer pursued his passion by studying meteorology at the University of Oklahoma. After documenting a massive F5 tornado that struck Moore, Oklahoma, on May 3, 1999, Reed became even more obsessed with extreme storm chasing. Since then, he has driven more than 50,000 miles each year from the Mexican to the Canadian borders and has captured more than 200 tornadoes on film. In 2003, Timer started TornadoVideos.net, a company devoted to extreme storm chasing footage and research. Timmer is regularly featured on the Discovery Channel's television series, *StormChasers*.
