Major medical operations have become routine, helping to drive the cost of health care to astronomical levels. Heart disease, cancer, and stroke are the country's leading causes of death, even though billions are spent each year to "battle" these conditions. *Forks Over Knives* examines the profound claim that most, if not all, of the degenerative diseases that afflict us can be controlled, or even reversed, by rejecting animal-based and processed foods. Speakers and Issues: T. Colin Campbell

The Speakers and Issues Series will present Dr. T. Colin Campbell, retired Professor Emeritus of Nutritional Biochemistry at Cornell University, at 7 p.m. Thursday, March 29, in Akin Auditorium. Campbell has initiated a true revolution in the world of medicine by claiming that nutrition should be one of the main subjects in any medical curriculum. After 20 years of collecting data in China and the Philippines, Campbell concluded that the most certain way to achieve a healthy lifestyle is only by following a plant-based diet. Campbell is the author of more than 300 published research articles in the field of nutrition and disease. *The China Study*, his major publication, is considered by many to be the cornerstone of medical nutrition. In an effort to improve recycling opportunities at MSU, three containers are being placed around campus for students, staff, faculty, and the general public to use.
