MSU Post Office

Dear MSU Faculty and Staff,
Summer has arrived and a new academic year is right around the corner! In preparation for the 2013-14 academic year, this announcement serves to inform all departments of upcoming changes at MSU's Post Office which will take effect this fall. These changes are designed to help the MSU Post Office become more fiscally sustainable as a service at the university, in a manner with minimal impact on daily operations. Starting this fall, there will be one daily afternoon delivery available to those interested university departments. The annual cost of the daily delivery service will be \$400.

Post Office box rental rates for individuals, organizations, and any departments not participating in the daily delivery service will be as follows, effective for the 2013-2014 academic year:

| Small box | \$60 per year |
| Medium box | \$75 per year |
| Large box | \$175 per year |

The MSU Post Office will continue offering numerous mail services and bulk mail support for university departments at a cost equal to and most often less than local off-campus alternatives. These services include folding, inserting, labeling, addressing, tabbing, sealing, cleaning of address files, and sorting bulk mailings in ZIP code order. Charges for these services starting in the fall 2013 will be as follows:
