He also spent more a decade in the insurance business. In 1996, he purchased a local sporting goods store. Since then he has thrived despite the entry of several big-box sports stores into the market and has built Jerry's Sporting Goods into the supplier of sports equipment to teams all across Texas and Oklahoma. Philosophy Club Presentation

Dr. Brinton Tench Coxe will deliver a lecture titled "Time, Space, Motion: An Exploration of Film Aesthetics" at 6 p.m. Thursday, October 24, in Shawnee Theater. The event is sponsored by the Midwestern State University Philosophy Club and is free and open to the public. Students and faculty are especially encouraged to attend.

Coxe will be discussing "certain innovations and transformation of global film style over the past 120 years." Coxe holds a Ph.D. in Slavic Studies from Columbia University, New York. His research projects include exploring images of Moscow in Russian and Soviet film and literature, as well as cities and urban space on film. He has taught courses on Russian and Soviet film, culture, and literature at Columbia University and New York University, as well as an introductory film course and a cities on film course at Drew University. In addition to teaching film courses, he also makes short films, one of which received an honorable mention at the Aerokrat'as Festival in Prague, 2005.
