Purchase requisitions can be processed for FY16 beginning Tuesday, September 1.

Also, in an effort to properly close FY15 and to ensure all purchase orders are paid in a timely manner, forward ALL invoices for PO purchases to the purchasing department as soon as possible. Do not hold invoices with hopes to pay using next fiscal year's funds. Orders for goods and services received in the current fiscal year must be paid for with the current fiscal year's funds.
