## In the Spotlight

**Soon-Mi Choi**, Assistant Professor of Athletic Training & Exercise Physiology, was an invited speaker at the 28th International Sport Science Congress 2016 commemorating the 1988 Seoul Olympic Games at Hanyang University, South Korea, August 25-27. She presented "Building a better offstage future for dancers: based on the sports medicine in the United States."

**Mitzi Lewis**, Associate Professor of Mass Communication, and **Jim Sernoe**, Chair and Associate Professor of Mass Communication, presented a research paper as part of a panel on college media at the Association of Education in Journalism and Mass Communication conference in Minneapolis. Lewis was also reappointed production editor of the scholarly journal *Teaching Journalism and Mass Communication* as well as webmaster for the Small Programs Interest Group. Sernoe also presented as part of a teaching panel and was appointed co-coordinator of the GIFT (Great Ideas For Teaching) competition. Additionally, Lewis and mass communication major **Robin Reid** presented research findings as part of a panel on long-form journalism. Reid is part of MSU's EURECA undergraduate research program, and Lewis serves as her mentor.

**Andrew J. Allen**, Assistant Professor of Music, has had two musical arrangements for saxophone quartet (John Dowland's *Come Again, Sweet Love* and Palestrina's *Adoramus Te*) published by Dorn Publications Inc. of Medfield, Massachusetts.

**Sharon Arnoult**, Associate Professor of History, presented a paper, "Women's Prayers and Communion in the Early Modern English Church" at the Sixteenth Century Studies Conference meeting in Bruges,

Belgium, on August 19. She also chaired a session on "Connecting with Women in Reform Movements and Transnationality II: Connecting with Women Transnationally" at the same conference.
