### Artist-Lecture Series: RJ Mitte

The Artist-Lecture Series will present RJ Mitte, co-star of television's *Breaking Bad* at 7 p.m. Tuesday, October, 18, in Akin Auditorium. Mitte was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at age 3 and now serves as the official ambassador for United Cerebral Palsy and Shriners Hospitals for Children. He is the celebrity face for the #CutTheBull campaign launched in October 2014 in support of children with disabilities, and works to remove the stigma associated with disabilities. He is also involved with the Screen Actors Guild-American Federation of Television and Radio Artists as a member of the union's Performers with Disabilities Committee. Currently, he is working with Parents Advocacy Coalition for Educational Rights' National Center for Bullying Prevention on a nationwide campaign designed to educate those who see bullying, and leveraging peer-to-peer support. Mitte speaks about his strategies for overcoming obstacles, including being bullied.
