Speakers and Issues Series, James Hoggard Reading Series to present Eddie Chuculate

The Speakers and Issues Series and the James Hoggard Reading Series will present Native American author Eddie Chuculate at 7 p.m. Monday, October 24, at the Wichita Falls Museum of Art at MSU. Chuculate, a Creek-Cherokee Indian, was born in 1972 in Muskogee, Oklahoma. He was a sportswriter for nine years before attending the Institute of American Indian Arts in Santa Fe and was persuaded by the poet Jon Davis to change his major from Museum Studies to Creative Writing. He held a Wallace Stegner Fellowship in Creative Writing at Stanford University, and earned a master's degree from the University of Iowa's Writers' Workshop. The first story in *Cheyenne Madonna*, Chuculate's collection of linked short stories, won an O'Henry Prize in 2007, and the second story received a Pushcart Prize Special Mention. Chuculate wrote while working as editor at newspapers in Tulsa, Albuquerque, Denver, and Abu Dhabi. Universities across the country including the University of Arizona, Pennsylvania State, and the University of Oklahoma include his work in their literature courses. Andrew J. Allen, Assistant Professor of Music, authored an article on achieving a quality jazz saxophone sound that appears in the October 2016 issue of *JazzEd* magazine.

Frank B. Wyatt, Graduate Coordinator and Professor of Athletic Training and Exercise Physiology, co-authored a recent publication in *The Journal of Exercise Medicine*, Vol. 1 (5): 1-20. The title of the publication was "Post-Exercise Recovery Modalities: A Meta-Analysis." The lead author on this publication was **James Odom**, who was a graduate student in the Master of Science Exercise Physiology Program. James lost his life in a car wreck in July 2016.
