In the Spotlight

Frank B. Wyatt, Professor from the Department of Athletic Training & Exercise Physiology, along with three students of Exercise Physiology presented scholarly work at the Annual National Meeting of The American Society of Exercise Physiologists. The conference was held in Alliance, Ohio, on the campus of Mount Union University. Wyatt presented "Endurance Training/ Repetitive Motion and Psychological Well Being: Hemispheric Function and Outcome" and "Heart Rate Variability Indicates Myocardial Adaptation." **Dalton Smith**, adjunct instructor, presented "Low Carbohydrate Diets Effect on Performance." **Hannah Ross**, graduate student, presented "An Assessment of Muscle Glycogen Trends in Elite Cyclists during a High Intensity Training Camp at Altitude." **Carpenter Wyatt**, undergraduate student, presented "Exercise Medicine: Lessons from Study Abroad." The conference was held October 21-22.

Scott Meddaugh, presented a conference paper titled "Improving Reservoir Production Forecast Accuracy – Application of Lessons Learned from Conventional Reservoirs" at the 2016 American Association of Petroleum Geologists and the Society of Exploration Geophysicists International Conference and Exhibition in September. He also was selected to chair two of the meetings' technical sessions. Meddaugh also received an Outstanding Technical Editor for 2016 award from the *Society of Petroleum Engineers Economics and Management Journal*.

Whitney A. Snow, Assistant Professor of History, presented "Underground Wonderland: A History of Cathedral Caverns" at the Gulf South History & Humanities Conference in Mobile, Alabama, October 13-15. Snow is also a member of the board of directors.
