IN THE SPOTLIGHT

MSU's Student Council for Exceptional Children members attended the Texas Council for Exceptional Children 36th Annual Conference in Austin June 8-9.

While at the conference, they received the Super Chapter Award. This award is given to a student chapter in Texas each year that shows outstanding dedication to serving exceptional children in their community. MSU's organization logged 632 volunteer hours and served approximately 381 exceptional members of our community.

Dr. Frank B. Wyatt, Professor in the Department of Athletic Training & Exercise Physiology, gave three presentations in South Korea June 11-23. The first and second presentations were given at the Cha Medical Center in Suwon, South Korea. The topics were, "The Physiology and Training of Cyclists" and "Myocardial Function during Increased Work," respectively. The last presentation was given at The 29th International Sport Science Congress at Dankook University in Cheonan, South Korea. The presentation was "Effects of Endurance Training on Cardiovascular Physiology."

Dr. Marcy Brown Marsden, Dean of the College of Science and Mathematics, participated in the 89th annual American Council on Education National Women's Leadership Forum in Washington D.C. June 21-23. The forum develops practical leadership skills for senior level women administrators. Also on June 27 Marsden presented a talk titled, "Seasonal variations, soil associations, and geographical distribution in *Hexalectris* orchids," at the Botanical Society of America meeting/Botany 2017 in Fort Worth. She was the session chair for the Ecology Section for contributed papers in Population Biology.

EURECA students **Nikki Bussue** and **Melissa Whitwood** presented their project, "Integrating Children's Literature in Elementary Math Methods: Fostering Understandings and Connections," at two conferences. Bussue presented at the Texas Council of Exceptional Individuals Conference in Austin while Whitwood presented at the National Alpha Chi Conference in Louisville, Kentucky, and won the Patricia A. Williams Prize in Education. Their faculty mentor for the project is **Dr. Dittika Gupta**.

Dr. Eduardo Colmenares, Assistant Professor of Computer Science, attended GTC (GPU Technological Conference) in San Jose, California, May 26-29. GTC is the largest and most important event of the year for GPU developers worldwide. The conference offers 500+ sessions covering GPU related topics, including scientific computing, high performance computing, algorithms, astronomy & astrophysics, performance optimization, finance, healthcare, accelerated analytics, and autonomous vehicles. The conference directly supports use of the Turing cluster computer installed in the Department of Computer Science in Fall 2016.
