the guest speaker of the Dillard Energy Center Distinguished Speaker Series on Thursday, November 16. The campus and local communities will have two opportunities to hear Campbell speak: 3:30 p.m. and 7 p.m. in Dillard 101. Campbell is a relationship builder who gets deals done where others don't. While still a student at Texas Tech, he and his partner John Sellers launched a real estate company. After graduating from Tech with a master's degree in finance, Campbell put his business career on hold to play guard for the Indianapolis Colts. Injuries cut short his NFL career.

After the NFL, he resumed his career in real estate. When the real estate market plunged after the stock market crash of 2008, Campbell and Sellers reunited to try their hand in the oil business. The pair specialized in getting oil lease deals done with individuals, building win-win relationships. Starting from nothing, the company eventually completed more than 10,000 individual lease transactions. The pair sold their business to Parsley Energy in 2017 for \$2.8 billion and have already launched a follow-on energy company.
