IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Several faculty and students of the **Radiologic Sciences Program** attended the Texas Society of Radiologic Technologist's (TSRT) annual conference held in The Woodlands, April 5-6. Two faculty members were recognized for service to the profession.

- **Vicki Sanders** was awarded the Wade L. Hoots lecture series award in recognition of her contributions to the profession, professionalism and dedication as a lecturer and/or member.
- **Gary Morrison** was awarded the Sharon Coffey Educator of the Year Award.

- **Debra Wynne and Jessyca Wagner** accompanied 23 radiologic sciences students who participated in educational events sponsored by the TSRT.

Rodney Fisher spoke at the 86th annual Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologist's annual conference. His topic was "Martyrs of Radiology."

Beth Veale spoke at the Oklahoma Society of Radiologic Technologist in Tulsa. Beth presented two topics titled "Digital Imaging Update" and "Radiology and Terrorism: Bomb Blast Injuries."

Gary Goldberg, Professor of Art, had his work "Yellow Running Man" (4'X6') on view April 7-8 in Fort Worth as part of The American Institute of Architects annual Fort Worth Tour of Homes 2018. Goldberg's work was also featured April 13-15 at the Dallas Art Fair. This was the 10th anniversary of this annual show consisting of 100 international galleries.

Recently, Goldberg's work was added to the Sarah Moody Gallery of Art Collection at the University of Alabama. This work came to the university's collection by the bequest of The Morgan Family Estate. The Morgan Gallery was a prominent Art Gallery in Kansas City in the 1970s and 1980s, and they represented Goldberg's work.

The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center Collection in Dallas recently acquired six of Goldberg's works from the series, "Finding the University in Oaxaca." They now have one large 3'X10' felted textile work and four large 26"X40" photographs as part of their permanent collection.

AJ Lopez, Coordinator of Social Media, recently earned two CASE IV Accolades awards: Bronze award for Social Media – Creative Use for his "MSU Admissions Black Friday" entry and Honorable Mention in Color Photography – Campus Environment for his "Winter is Coming" entry. CASE District IV is the chapter of the

Council for the Advancement and Support of Education representing 2,904 members from 261 institutions in Arkansas, Louisiana, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas.
