IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Frank B. Wyatt, Professor in the Department of Athletic Training and Exercise Physiology, is first author on a publication in the *Journal of Exercise Physiology* online, volume 21 (3): 71-78. The title of the research publication is "A Comparison of Heart Rate Measures between Fit Cohorts of Cyclists." Co-authors are graduate students Kristin Russell and Nicole Munoz.

Francine Carraro, Director of the WFMA at MSU, presented the Pacesetter Address at the 16th Annual CASETA Symposium in San Antonio on April 27. Titled "The Texas Scene is the American Scene," the presentation described and analyzed the historical and cultural significance of the 1936 exhibition at the Dallas Museum of Fine Art that marked the Texas Centennial and announced a new frontier in Texas art. The conference of the Center for the Study and Exhibition of Early Texas Art included speakers Eleanor J. Harvey, Senior Curator of the Smithsonian American Art Museum, and Mark Thistlewaite, Art History Chair of Texas Christian University.
