Dillard Energy Center Distinguished Speaker Series: Rhett Bennett

The Dillard Energy Center will present Rhett Bennett, founder and CEO of Black Mountain, as part of its Distinguished Speaker Series at 7 p.m. Wednesday, November 14, in Dillard 101. Bennett was born in the coal country of Kentucky where his father ran the family coal mining business. He established Black Mountain 2007 to capture high-growth opportunities in the energy and natural resources markets. In 2017, Black Mountain Oil and Gas I sold its New Mexico assets to Marathon Oil Corporation for \$700 million. Black Mountain currently operates in the upstream, minerals and frac sand businesses. *Oil and Gas Investor* named Rhett a member of its 2017 "Forty Under Forty" recipients. IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Jessyca Wagner, Assistant Professor of Radiologic Sciences, presented a round table discussion titled "Getting Started Teaching Online: A Multimedia Course for Faculty" at the Association for the Advancement of Computing in Education (AACE) E-Learn Annual International Conference in Las Vegas, Nevada, on October 17.

Rodney Fisher, Assistant Professor of Radiologic Sciences, spoke at the Missouri Society of Radiologic Technologists District 1 (Kansas City/St. Joseph) Conference on October 20. The topic was "Legal Terms and the Suits No RT Wants to Wear," a discussion of medical battery and medical malpractice illustrated by recent lawsuits involving radiologic technologists.

At the national convention of the College Media Association and Associated Collegiate Press in Louisville, Kentucky, the website for the student newspaper, *The Wichitan*, was named a [Pacemaker Finalist](#), recognition the publication has received only once before. The Pacemaker is one of two top awards given nationally and is given to only about a dozen schools nationwide each year. Also at the conference, **Justin Marquart**, a junior in art, placed fourth in the national [Associated Collegiate Press Design of the Year competition for newspaper page/spread](#).

Gary Goldberg, Professor of Art, recently had a one-man exhibition of his Texas Singer Songwriters work at Southern Light Gallery located at Amarillo College, in Amarillo, Texas. In conjunction with this exhibition, *Texas Music Magazine* published a full-page story in their "ONE MORE NOTE" published in their current fall issue. Goldberg was also one of 10 artists featured in "Mexico," an exhibition at the Erin Cluley Gallery, which also included internationally known such as artists Francisco Toledo and Antonio Turok. This show was held in Dallas from August 25-October 7.

Goldberg recently was a reviewer for "Review Santa Fe Photo Festival" October 18-21, in Santa Fe, New Mexico. He was also part of a group exhibition, *Hand/ Eye*, at "Form and Concept" Gallery in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The exhibition runs from October 19-December 31. Goldberg also was part of an artist's talk on Saturday, October 27. He has three large-scale textiles on view in conjunction with this exhibition. Goldberg is also part of a group exhibition at "galleryFritz" of gallery artists in Santa Fe, New Mexico.
