IN THE SPOTLIGHT

Richard Simpson, Assistant Professor of Computer Science, presented a lightning talk on “The Day-Stout-Warren Algorithm” at the South Central Conference for the Consortium for Computing Sciences Colleges on April 5 at the University of Texas at Dallas. **Catherine Stringfellow**, Professor of Computer Science, also presented a lightning talk on “Assessing Teamwork.” **Eduardo Colmenares**, **Tina Johnson** and Simpson served as session chairs. In addition, two students under the mentorship of Johnson presented posters.

Professor of Art **Gary Goldberg**’s textile work “Finding the Universe in Oaxaca, Red Ground, Gray Sky” was on exhibit April 10-14 at the Dallas Art Fair. His work will also be featured in a two-person exhibition at galleryFRITZ in Santa Fe, New Mexico. The exhibition will open April 26, and is titled “Photographic Evidence in Textiles, Gary Goldberg & Karen Hampton.” The exhibit will be on display through May. Goldberg will exhibit eight large-scale textiles based on his photographs.

Goldberg will be one of 10 featured artists in “The Great Create 2019” on April 28 at the Nasher Sculpture Center in Dallas. Goldberg will demonstrate the wet felting process and lead children through a day of creative art making.

Keith Williamson, MSU Medical Director, maintains an interest in public health, hospital affairs, and research related to the Hotter’N Hell Hundred. Williamson was listed as a co-author on “Renal stress and kidney injury biomarkers in response to endurance cycling in the heat

with and without ibuprofen” in the May 2018 *Journal of Science and Medicine in Sport* 21 (12) DOI: 10.1016/j.jsams.2018.05.003. The research found mild reversible acute kidney injury that was independent of ibuprofen; the study did not address the risk of acute papillary necrosis associated with nonsteroidal anti-inflammatory use and endurance exercise.

Williamson lectured on sexually transmitted infections at the North Texas Regional Training Conference in collaboration with the County Health Department on April 4. He was a co-presenter with Jason Wheat, Program Manager for Communicable Disease Prevention Services, and Tiffany Torres, epidemiologist.

At the Spring Hospital General Staff Meeting, Williamson was recognized for Commitment to Quality and Safety for his work with peer review, credentialing, utilization review, and infectious disease/antibiotic stewardship. Williamson has recently been appointed to the United Regional Health Care System Board of Directors for a three-year term starting in July.
