Frank B. Wyatt, Professor in the Department of Athletic Training and Exercise Physiology, recently co-authored two August 2019 publications in peer-reviewed journals. Wyatt co-authored "A Meta-Analytic Review of Muscle Glycogen Replenishment" in the *Journal of Exercise Physiology*, Vol. 22 (4): 95-111. In addition, he co-authored "The Effect of Aerobic and Resistance Training on Glycemic Control of Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus: Meta-Analytic Study" in the *Journal of Exercise Medicine*, Vol. 4 (2): 1-13. Additional authors on these publications included MSU graduates **Ian Macklin**, **Ana Lopez**, and **Melaeni Ramos**. Also included as a co-author was Dr. Grant Ralston from the University of the West of Scotland.
