Artist-Lecture Series: Megan Phelps-Roper

The Artist-Lecture Series will present Megan Phelps-Roper at 7 p.m. Wednesday, January 23, in Akin Auditorium. Phelps-Roper is the granddaughter of Fred Phelps, founder of Westboro Baptist Church, known for its protests at funeral services for soldiers and for its verbal attacks on the LGBT community. Phelps-Roper helped spread the

church's doctrine of hate through social media, engaging in arguments with those who questioned her. After interaction with others who showed empathy toward those who were hurting, she began to question her church's celebration of human tragedy, left the church and renounced its teachings. Admission is \$20 to the general public; \$18 for senior citizens, active-duty military, and MSU alumni; free to MSU students, faculty, and staff with ID.
