Shootapalooza

The Wichita Falls Museum of Art at MSU Texas will hold an opening reception for the Shootapalooza Photo Collective's exhibit, "Diversity: Alternative Paths in Contemporary Photography," from 6-8 p.m. Friday, March 15. Shootapalooza is an artist collective of photographers who exhibit, tour and teach. The exhibition will be in conjunction with the "Nocturnes" exhibit at the Juanita Harvey Art Gallery. Shootapalooza was formed in 2014 by the late Judy Sherrod. It is a diverse group of mostly women photographers from the U.S., Canada, the U.K., and Australia who collaborate, inspire, and teach each other. Soon-Mi Choi, assistant professor/graduate coordinator in the Department of Athletic Training & Exercise Physiology, presented as a co-author at the 2019 Texas American College of Sports Medicine in Fort Worth February 28-March 1. The title of her poster presentation was "The Acute Effects of Different Squat Intensities on Vertical Jump Performance." Students **Jeffrey Hamon**, **Darian Wetzel**, **Ellisa Louisy**, and **Emily Edwards** from the MSU athletic training and exercise physiology department participated in the student quiz bowl. **Nicole**

Munoz, graduate student, participated and helped the team as a scorekeeper.

Frank B. Wyatt, Professor in the Department of Athletic Training and Exercise Physiology, is co-investigator and co-author on three research presentations and three published abstracts, respectively. The titles of the presentations and abstracts are the following: 1) "Muscle Glycogen Depletion and Replenishment: A Meta-Analytic Review"; 2) "The Effect of Aerobic and Resistance Training on Glycemic Control in Type 2 Diabetes Mellitus: Meta-Analytic Study"; and 3) "The Influence of Strength, Torque, and Range of Motion on Injury Rates in Distance Runners: A Meta-Analytic Review." The presentations were part of the annual meeting of the Texas Chapter of The American College of Sports Medicine (TACSM) in Fort Worth. The abstracts were published as the conference proceedings in the *International Journal of Exercise Science*.
