

Inflation

- General rise in the price level
- Inflation reduces the "purchasing power" of money
 - Consumer Price Index (CPI)

12-month percentage change, Consumer Price Index, by region, all items, not seasonal adjusted



Data for some metropolitan areas are bimonthly.




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


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


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


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


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


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
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


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Chart 1. Over-the-year percent change in CPI-U, South region, March 2014–March 2017 Percent change
