The degree of Bachelor of Music/Teacher Certification is 122 hours, not including remedial coursework. Students should attempt to pass the piano proficiency by the end of the fourth semester. To be admitted to the Education program in the fourth or fifth semester, the student must have a 2.5 grade-point average for six hours of English, have completed 60 hours with no grade below a C in the major area, and have an overall (all coursework) gpa of at least 2.75
