Academic Information

Graduate Catalog

Visit the [Graduate Catalog](#) to view the current and archived graduate catalogs. In the graduate catalog, students can view the program and degree requirements for that particular year, as well as course descriptions, academic processes, and other useful information.

MSU Portal

In the Portal, students can...

- access their student Gmail account.
- register for classes via Banner Self-Service.
- view/pay their tuition and fees via TouchNet.
- access their online classes via Desire2Learn.
- view their academic record and unofficial transcript via Banner Self-Service.
- access their Moffett Library account and Moffett Library databases.
- browse student organizations and campus events via Mustangs Link.

To access the Portal, visit the [MSU Welcome](#) page and log in with your username and password. To access the MSU applications, hover over the maroon banner on the left side of the page and select "HOME (Student)" from the options. Your username is your first initial + your middle initial + the first twelve letters of your last name + the month and day of your date of birth. For example, Robert T. Jones was born on January 3, so his username is rtjones0103. Your password is your Mustangs ID followed by an exclamation mark. To install the Portal as an app on your phone, search for myMSUTexas in the App Store or Google Play. Send an email to helpdesk@msutexas.edu to report a problem with the Portal or your Portal login.

Class Schedule

Visit the [Class Schedule](#) to view the latest class schedule and important registration deadlines. Click on a term to view the complete course listing for that term, as well as other important information. The complete course listing includes the five-digit course reference number (CRN) for each course. Graduate courses are designated by 5000-level and 6000-level numbers.

Class Registration Instructions

When registration is open, students can use these instructions to register for classes online via the Portal. When registration is closed, students need to use the instructions on page 8 to drop a class or to withdraw from the university.

1. Contact your academic advisor to be advised and to have your advising hold removed.
2. Log into the Portal.
3. Under MSU Applications, click on Banner Self-Service.
4. From the Banner Menu dropdown, click on Student Profile to view active holds on your account. View each hold to identify which office(s) you need to contact to get the hold lifted.
5. Before you register for classes, you will need to complete the **Student Financial Responsibility Agreement Survey (SFRA)**, follow the instructions on the [SFRA Instructional Video](#).
6. From the Banner Menu dropdown, click on Registration. Here you can prepare, plan, view or register for classes.
7. Click on Register for Classes and select the term for which you want to register and click Continue. If an error message appears, review steps 4-5. If error persists, contact the graduate school for assistance.
8. Select the Subject (click the open space to activate the drop-down options).
9. Enter the 4-digit Course Number and click Search. Leave the remaining spaces blank.
10. Select the class/section, click Add. It will appear in the summary section as status "pending." To add more classes click Search Again and repeat steps 8-10.
11. Click Submit at the bottom of the page to complete registration.
12. If you see a message saying that a class could not be added, take note of the reason for the error and contact your academic advisor for assistance.
13. Review your schedule carefully to ensure that you have registered for the correct classes and sections.
14. If you need to make changes to your schedule, repeat steps 6-11 to add classes. To drop a class, click the Action box for the class, select Web Drop/Delete, and click Submit.

Financial Aid Enrollment Status

For financial aid purposes, graduate students are considered full-time when they are enrolled in six or more credit hours per semester and half-time when they are enrolled in three credit hours per semester. Graduate students who are enrolled in two or less credit hours per semester are not eligible for financial aid. Please note that post-baccalaureate non-degree-seeking students and students pursuing a graduate certificate are not eligible to receive financial aid.

Academic Enrollment Status

For fall and spring semesters, typical full-time enrollment for graduate students is nine or more credit hours. For summer sessions, typical full-time enrollment for graduate students is six or more credit hours. The maximum course load for a graduate student is sixteen credit hours for fall and spring semesters and six credit hours for summer sessions. Students in the Family Nurse Practitioner and Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner programs are considered full-time when they are enrolled in six credit hours during fall and spring semesters. If a graduate student is employed full-time, their recommended course load is three credit hours per semester.

Academic Enrollment Status for Graduate Students on an F1 Visa

Graduate students on an F1 Visa must enroll in a minimum of nine credit hours each fall and spring semester; of the nine credit hours, six credit hours must be face-to-face. Classes coded as hybrid may be counted as face-to-face. Students with a graduate assistantship may count the assistantship as three face-to-face credit hours to meet F1 Visa requirements. If a student has less than nine credit hours remaining for their degree in their last semester of study, they may seek authorization from the Global Education Office for a reduced course load; however, the student must enroll in one face-to-face or hybrid class in their last semester, or they must be employed in a face-to-face graduate assistantship in their last semester.

Graduate Academic Performance Standards

Graduate degree-seeking students must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher to be in good academic standing and must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher to graduate. Post-baccalaureate non-degree-seeking students must maintain a GPA of 2.0 or higher to be in good academic standing. Graduate programs may have additional academic performance standards, so students should consult with their graduate coordinator or academic advisor about program-specific standards. A student who needs or wants to replace a grade may retake the class for which the grade was received once they have permission from their graduate coordinator.

Graduate Honors Criteria

Graduate courses are more challenging and demanding than undergraduate courses, and graduate students are held to higher academic performance standards than undergraduate students; therefore, graduate honors criteria differ from undergraduate honors criteria.

- 4.000 GPA » Summa Cum Laude
- 3.900 – 3.999 GPA » Magna Cum Laude
- 3.800 – 3.899 GPA » Cum Laude

Academic Dishonesty and Artificial Intelligence

Policies and procedures for academic dishonesty are detailed in the [MSU Student Handbook](#).

No university policy exists regarding the use of artificial intelligence, or AI. Students need to consult with their professors regarding the use of AI in their classes and classwork.

Time Limit for Completion of a Graduate Program

All requirements for a graduate degree or certificate must be completed within a period of six years from the time of first enrollment in a graduate-level course, unless a shorter time period is specified by a graduate program. A proportionately longer period of time is granted for programs that require more than 36 graduate hours. Students who may be affected by this policy should contact their graduate coordinator for further details.

Graduate Scholarships

MSU has transitioned to an online scholarship manager in which students can submit one application to be matched with all the MSU scholarships for which they are eligible. Visit the [Graduate Scholarships and Graduate Assistantships](#) for more information and to view the complete list of scholarships that are available to graduate students at MSU. In the list, find your program to see available scholarships and contact information. Please note that post-baccalaureate non-degree-seeking students and students pursuing a graduate certificate are not eligible to receive scholarships.

Textbooks

After registering for classes, students can use these instructions to see what textbooks are required and recommended for each of their classes.

1. Visit the [MSU Bookstore](#) and click on Textbooks at the top of the page.
2. Type your Mustangs ID and click Enter.
3. Select the appropriate term from the drop-down menu and click Find Courses.
4. Purchase your textbooks from the bookstore or anywhere you prefer.

Desire2Learn

Desire2Learn, or D2L, is the online learning platform used by MSU for all its online classes. Students can access D2L via the MSU Portal. Visit the [Student D2L Aids](#) for D2L tips and guides. Visit the [Online Problem Reporting System](#) to report a problem in D2L. Please note that online classes do not show in D2L until the first day of classes.

Degree Works

Via the MSU Portal, students can access Degree Works to track their progress toward their degree. Students can view their GPA, catalog term, major requirements, and class history, as well as classes that are in progress and classes that have not been taken yet. Students should contact their academic advisor if they have questions about requirements or course substitutions.

Graduate Writing Help

Anna Lerew-Phillips, an alumna of MSU with a master's degree in English and expertise in technical writing, is available to graduate students to help with their academic writing. Anna can assist with formulating research questions, organizing ideas and manuscripts, citing sources, writing in a scholarly voice, and recognizing writing errors. Her role does not include proofreading or detailed editing, but she can show students how to proofread and edit their own writing. Send an email to gradwritinghelp@msutexas.edu to contact Anna and request her help. Allow a minimum of 48 hours for Anna to review your writing and provide you with feedback.

Graduate Assistantships

To be eligible for an assistantship in the fall or spring, graduate students must be enrolled in classes. To be eligible for an assistantship in the summer, graduate students must be enrolled in summer classes or they must have been enrolled in classes during the preceding spring semester. Graduate assistants are expected to maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher. Students can contact their graduate coordinator to inquire about available assistantships within their program, or they can search for graduate assistantships on [MustangsHIRE](#).

Change of Major

If a student wants to change their major, they need to contact Jose Avitia, Graduate Academic Counselor, to initiate the process and complete a Change of Major form. International students on F1 Visa must first contact the Global Education Office to ensure the desired new major meets the visa requirements.

Course Drop Instructions

When registration is closed, students can use these instructions to drop a course before the drop deadline for a grade of W. Dropping a course after the drop deadline will result in a grade of F for the course. Visit the [Withdrawal and Drop Schedule](#) for drop deadlines and refunds information. If a student needs to drop all their courses for the semester, they need to withdraw from the university by following the withdrawal instructions.

1. Inform your academic advisor that you need to drop a course so they can determine how the drop will affect your time to degree completion. If you have a graduate assistantship or have been awarded any scholarships, your academic advisor can determine how they will be affected by the drop.
2. If you have received financial aid, inform the Financial Aid Office that you need to drop a course so they can determine how the drop will affect your enrollment status and your financial aid award.
3. If you are a student athlete, inform Athletics that you need to drop a course.
4. If you are an international student, inform the Global Education Office that you need to drop a course.

5. Log into the MSU Portal.
6. Under MSU Applications, click on Banner Self-Service.
7. From the Banner Menu dropdown, click on Registration.
8. Click on Register for Classes and select the term for which you want to drop the course and click Continue. If an error message appears that restricts registration, check your Student Profile for holds and contact the issuing department to get it lifted. If error persists, contact the graduate school for assistance.
9. In the Summary section, click the drop-down arrow in the Action box for the course you want to drop and select Web Drop/Delete. Click Submit.
10. If you see a message saying that a class could not be added, take note of the reason for the error and contact your academic advisor for assistance.
11. Review your schedule carefully to ensure that you dropped the correct class.

Withdrawal Instructions

If a student needs to drop all their courses for the semester and withdraw from the university, they need to follow these instructions before the drop deadline to receive a grade of W for the courses. Withdrawing from the university after the drop deadline will result in a grade of F for the courses. Visit the [Withdrawal and Drop Schedule](#) for drop deadlines and refunds information. If a student is unable to withdraw themselves from the university due to medical or other reasons, only a person who has legal power of attorney for the student can withdraw the student from the university.

1. If you are a student athlete, inform Athletics that you need to withdraw from the university.
2. If you are an international student, inform the Global Education Office that you need to withdraw from the university.
3. Call the Student Affairs Office at 940-397-7500, email student.affairs@msutexas.edu, or visit the Student Affairs Office in Clark Student Center to initiate the withdrawal process.
4. Once a withdrawal slip is completed and signed, copies of the slip will be distributed to the Registrar's Office, Business Office, and Financial Aid Office, and your academic advisor will be notified.
5. When you are ready, contact your academic advisor to determine your next steps for completing your degree or certificate.

Graduate Student Reactivation

If a graduate student has not attended MSU for one long semester (fall or spring) and wants to return, they need to submit the [Graduate School Reactivation Form](#). This applies to graduate students who have not graduated and who want to return to the same graduate program. Email complete form to Jose Avitia, Graduate Academic Counselor.

Graduate Student Readmission

If a graduate student has not attended MSU for one year or more and wants to return, they need to submit a new application to McAda Graduate School and pay the \$25 readmission fee. Visit the [Returning Students](#) page for application instructions.

Graduation Application Instructions

The deadline to apply for May 2026 graduation is February 26, 2026.

1. Visit the [Apply for Graduation](#) page.
2. Complete the Application for Graduation and the Diploma Distribution Form. Both forms can be emailed to registrar@msutexas.edu or submitted in person to the Registrar's Office in Hardin Administration Building.
3. Pay the \$40 graduation fee online via TouchNet, by personal check payable to Midwestern State University, in cash at the Registrar's Office only (do not mail cash), or by money order payable to Midwestern State University.
4. Keep an eye on your email for correspondence from the Degree Audit Team regarding your graduation application and your degree audit.

Commencement

Commencement ceremonies are conducted in December and May. Students who complete their degree in the summer are encouraged to attend the December commencement ceremony. Students who complete their degree in the fall are required to attend the December commencement ceremony, and students who complete their degree in the spring are required to attend the May commencement ceremony. If a student cannot attend commencement, they must submit the Request for Permission for Graduation in Absentia form to the Registrar's Office.
