The College of Education, Nursing and Health Professions at the University of Hartford invites applications for two (2) full-time (12-month, non-tenure track) positions at the rank of Clinical Assistant Professor. Start date: July 1, 2022. One candidate will serve as the Assistant Director and Clinical Coordinator of the Radiologic Technology (RAD) Program in the Department of Health Sciences. The second candidate will serve as the Clinical Coordinator of our Advanced Certificate Programs (ACPs) in computed tomography (CT), magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) and ultrasound (SONO).

Required Qualifications for the RAD Assistant Director/Clinical Coordinator: Master's degree in the Radiologic Sciences, Education or related field; current ARRT certification and registration in radiography (R); minimum of two years' clinical experience in Radiologic Technology; one year's experience as an instructor in a JRCERT-accredited radiography program and with students from diverse backgrounds and experience; documented proficiency in inclusive curriculum development, clinical program instruction, supervision and evaluation, and academic advising; demonstrated experience with maintaining professional clinical affiliations and ability/willingness to establish new partnerships.

Required Qualifications for the ACP Clinical Coordinator: Master's degree in the Radiologic Sciences, Education or related field; current ARRT certification and registration in radiography (R) and at least one advanced modality certification in either CT, MRI, or ultrasound. Candidates credentialed with the ARDMS will also be considered. Minimum of two year's clinical experience in medical imaging, including one year's experience instructing and/or supervising students from diverse backgrounds and experience as part of a JRCERT or CAAHEP-accredited medical imaging program.

Preferred Qualifications for Both Positions: Doctoral degree in a Health Profession or Education-related discipline; 2+ years of full-time clinical experience in a variety of radiographic procedures including general, fluoroscopic, surgical and trauma imaging, or 2+ years full-time clinical experience in CT, MRI and/or ultrasound; proficiency in evaluation, instruction, and prior administrative experience in an allied health program or department; a record of professional productivity in the Radiologic and Imaging Sciences.
