

Inline Rubric

Instead of always opening in another window or dialog, inline rubric now expands down the evaluation panel, allowing the evaluator to see both the rubric and the submission at the same time.

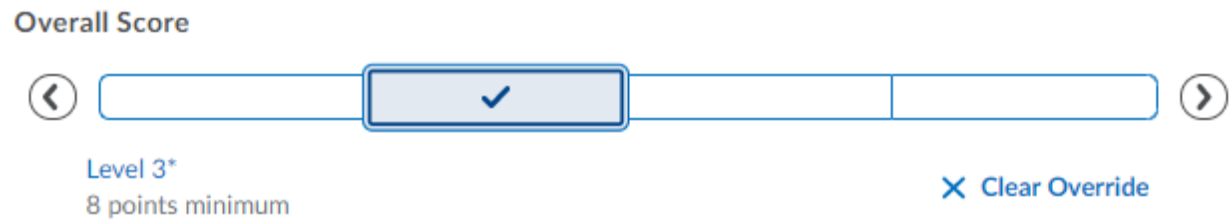
