Timeline for Student Sexual Misconduct Cases	Ongoing	Title IX	President	The investigation, resolution, and any appeal under the student sexual misconduct policy will be conducted in a thorough and timely manner designed to provide all parties with resolution. A typical investigation will not exceed 60 days, although this timeframe may be extended if additional time is necessary to ensure the integrity and completeness of the investigation, to comply with a request by external law enforcement for delay to gather evidence for a criminal investigation, to accommodate the availability of witnesses and/or investigators, to account for complexities of a case, including the number of witnesses, volume of information provided by the parties, timeliness of communication between the parties/witnesses and investigators, or for other legitimate reasons. The Title IX Coordinator will notify the parties in writing of timeframe extensions and their reason(s).	Title IX Regulations TTUS Policy

VAWA Ongoing Prevention and Awareness Campaign	Ongoing	Title IX	President	Coordinate and/or collect information on programming, initiatives, and strategies during the year focused on increasing understanding of topics relevant to and skills for addressing dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking, using a range of strategies with students and employees throughout the institution. Ensure the campaign includes the five required elements: 1) Statement MSU prohibits those offenses. 2) Definition of those offenses in the applicable jurisdiction. 3) Definition of consent, with reference to sexual offenses, in the applicable jurisdiction. 4) Safe and positive options for bystander intervention. 5) Recognition of signs of abusive behavior and how to avoid potential attacks.
